
Field Dates: September 11- October 5, 2021

Mode: Mixed Telephone and On-line


Key Takeaways: COVID-19 Among Dominicans

Share of Dominicans who contracted COVID-19 in New York (24%) and New Jersey (30%) surpassed the percentage for the total Hispanic/Latino population in both states, 19% and 21%, respectively.




Key Takeaways: Impact of COVID-19

 A sizeable percentage of Dominicans held jobs that put them at greater risk during the pandemic.



Key Takeaways: Impact of COVID-19

• Substantial share of Dominicans either lost their job (17%), saw their job hours reduced (31%), or were furloughed (8%) due to COVID-19.




Key Takeaways: Impact of COVID-19

- Since the beginning of the Pandemic:
 - most Dominicans (58%) have <u>not</u> applied for unemployment benefits,
 - while 29% have applied and received unemployment benefits,
 - and only 8% applied and were denied benefits.


Key Takeaways: Impact of COVID-19

- Dominican businesses have been positively affected by COVID-19
- Of Dominicans who requested financial assistance:
 - 90% received assistance
 - In New York, 97% of those requesting received assistance
 - In New Jersey, 91% of those requesting received assistance
 - In Florida, the number of Dominicans who received assistance was less at 83%.



Key Takeaways: COVID-19 Mask Adherence

 Mask adherence during indoor activities was highest in New Jersey (86%) and New York (82%), and slightly lower in Florida (75%) At the height of COVID-19, how often did you wear a mask during indoor activities?



Key Takeaways: COVID-19 Mask Adherence

• Presently, most Dominicans (75%) continue to wear masks during indoor activities. Again, Dominicans 50 years of age or older, DR born, and Spanish-dominant adhere to mask wearing always or almost always at higher rates than their counterparts.

Key Takeaways: COVID-19 Vaccination

77% of Dominicans report being vaccinated

• 83% in New York, 76% in New Jersey, and 70% in Florida.


95% have received both doses or plan to receive the second dose

93% of Dominicans received a vaccine in their home state

Key Takeaways: COVID-19 Vaccination


 Most Dominicans received the Pfizer or Moderna Vaccines, while a smaller minority received the Johnson and Johnson vaccine.

Key Takeaways: COVID-19 Information

 Among unvaccinated Dominicans, most Dominicans know how to get a vaccine or can figure it out (55%).



Key Takeaways: COVID-19 Information

 Most Dominicans use social media (30%) or cable/local/network news (38%) as their primary source to obtain information about COVID-19.
