America's Voice Central America Survey:

- ► Total N=600 Central American residents in key countries n=150 in each country: El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua Respondents ages 16 to 39, representative of primary migration age cohort
- ► Margin of Error: <u>+</u> 4.0%
- ► Field Dates: July 21-31, 2023
- ➤ Survey interviews were conducted using a blended mode via live telephone and online, exclusively in Spanish language


- 1. Central American residents are highly attuned to information about the situation in the U.S.-Mexico border as well as U.S. immigration and asylum policies, but the veracity of that information varies.
- 2. Both traditional and social media are highly used and trusted sources of information about the US border.
- 3. Disinformation about the U.S.-Mexico border is widespread with sizable segments of Central Americans hearing and believing "open border" rhetoric.
- 4. Rhetoric about "open borders" is encouraging Central Americans to make the journey to the U.S.-Mexico border.






Central Americans report frequent communication with relatives in the United States – 44% speak with a relative once per week or more

How often do you speak with people in the U.S., whether it's a family member, a friend, or someone you know?




How much have you heard, read, or seen about the situation at the US-Mexico border?



Where did you read or hear a US politician say the "border is open"








Based on what you know, which of the following do you believe to be true about U.S. border policy?

- The U.S. has policies that do NOT allow the border to be open and it is very difficult to obtain asylum, even if the migrants have made the long journey.








Which of the following do you think is truer about U.S. border policy?

Implications

- 1. Disinformation about the U.S.-Mexico border is widespread with sizable segments of Central Americans hearing and believing "open border" rhetoric.
- 2. All statements presented to respondents were real quotes from American politicians and officials that have been made publicly, and several have become regular talking points regarding the southern border and are widely shared on social media.
- 3. Rhetoric about "open borders" is encouraging Central Americans to make the journey to the U.S.-Mexico border. These effects are strongest among the 16-24 age cohort, who are most likely to consider migrating.
- 4. Central American residents are well aware about the dangers of a journey to the border. However, given widespread fear over violence and safety of their family, one key pull factor that influences potential migrants to consider the journey to the United States is "open border" disinformation from politicians
- In particular, this 600-respondent poll has documented a clear correlation between exposure to false statements about "open borders", belief it might be true, and the resulting desire to migrate, or encourage friends/family to migrate to the U.S.
