According to data from the North Carolina SBOE posted to the SBOE's website, a total of 9,272 new free photo ID cards have been issued by County Board of Elections to whites, Blacks, and Latinos since 2019¹. This data includes a list of all free photo IDs issued, and the race and ethnicity of the person who obtained the ID². We can also sort by the number of new or original IDs issues and exclude duplicate or replacement IDs. This data is summarized below in Table 3. Given that hundreds of thousands of eligible voters in North Carolina lack a qualifying ID, the 9,272 IDs issues barely make any dent in the potential disenfranchisement these voters could face in 2024.
