METHODOLOGY

A total of 3,000 Latino registered voters nationwide were surveyed between October 8–22, 2025. The overall margin of error is ± 1.8 percentage points. Of these, 825 respondents reside in battleground Congressional districts as defined by the Cook Political Report on October 8, 2025; this subsample carries a margin of error of ± 3.4 percentage points.

In each of the following states—Arizona, California, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, and Texas—400 Latino registered voters were polled. These stand-alone state samples have a margin of error of ± 4.9 percentage points.

The survey was offered in English or Spanish, based on respondent preference. Overall, 15% of surveys were completed in Spanish. Respondents were reached via live telephone interviews, text-message invitations, and online panels. All online panels are verified to have registered voters matched against the voter file, and then BSP randomly selects panelist to interview. At the start of the interview BSP confirms that all participants are currently registered to vote.

The sample was weighted to align with the most recent U.S. Census estimates for Latino registered voters by age, education, nativity, Hispanic subgroup, gender, and state. Partisan affiliation estimates were matched to the latest national voter file. Among all respondents, 46% identified as Democrat, 26% as Republican, and 28% as Independent.

BSP Research and Shaw & Company jointly developed the survey instrument and conducted the analysis.
